BIG BEND RANCH STATE PARK (BBRSP)

From the Texas Parks and Wildlife Website: *"Welcome to the Other Side of Nowhere!"*

Big Bend Ranch State Park offers outdoor recreation for the truly adventurous. This remote park features rugged mountains, steep canyons, amazing views, unparalleled night skies, and solitude in a high desert setting. The park stretches along the Rio Grande in far west Texas, on the U.S.-Mexico border... The park has 238 miles of multiuse trails (for hiking, biking and horseback riding). Visitors can explore 70 miles of unmaintained dirt roads in high-clearance four-wheel-drive vehicles. The Rio Grande/Rio Bravo area offers great day-use access. Visitors can float, fish and hike, or drive the scenic Camino del Rio (FM 170). Each February, the park helps host the Chihuahuan Desert Bike Fest. Visit our Activities page to learn more."

The over 300,000 acres of the park (half the size of Rhode Island) resides across the southern portions of Brewster and Presidio County (mostly in Presidio County). It is filled with some of the more dramatic geological formations of the Big Bend like the famed Solitario, a dome like structure in the northeastern section of the park that was formed 35 million years ago. It also has some of the most rugged roads anywhere in the Big Bend area that are fit only for a 4-wheel drive, high clearance vehicle that might just be perfect for an adventurous filmmaker. If a primitive, rugged setting is what your script calls for, this is the place. Come Shoot 'Em Up in a great Texas State Park!

Those services are not always available to the in-park headquarters as is the case of some of the more remote settings like Back Gap WMA or Big Bend Ranch State Park.

"Barton Warnock Visitor Center serves as the eastern visitor center for Big Bend Ranch State Park and is located near Lajitas. Permits for backpacking and camping (no hookups) at Big Bend Ranch State Park can be obtained at Barton Warnock or at Fort Leaton State Historic Site, the western visitor center for the park. Visitors can also purchase river-use permits, licenses, and information about the Big Bend region."

Just on the eastern edge of Lajitas Golf Resort and Spa in southern Brewster County, the Warnock Center is well worth a "pre-scout" visit to give you an in-depth overview of the area.

LAJITAS GENERAL INFORMATION

Lajitas is both a community of South Brewster County and one of the great resorts of West Texas. To say Lajitas is fraught with history is an understatement.

Wikipedia says this about Lajitas: *"Lajitas is an unincorporated community in Brewster County, Texas...For many years the mayor of Lajitas was Clay Henry III, a 'beer-drinking' goat..."*

Texas History On-Line has this to say: *"...Lajitas is on the western edge of Big Bend National Park in southwestern Brewster County. It is at an altitude of 2,200 feet on a bluff overlooking the Rio Grande at the San Carlos ford of the old Comanche Trail, in the northern part of the Chihuahuan Desert and at the southern extreme of the Rocky Mountains. The name Lajitas is Spanish for "little flat rocks" and refers to the Boquillas flagstone of the area. The region was inhabited by Mexican Indians for many years. They were driven from the area by the Apaches and later by the Comanches during the eighteenth and nineteenth centuries. Anglo-Americans first arrived in the mid-1800s..."*

H. W. McGuirk, the leading citizen of Lajitas from 1902 to 1917, operated the store-saloon, farmed, and helped manage the Terlingua Mining Company. He also funded the construction of a church and a school... In 1916 the interruption of commerce by Francisco (Pancho) Villa's bandits brought Gen. John J. Pershing's troops to Lajitas, where they established a major cavalry post. In the 1980s a motel stood on the actual foundations of the post.

The Lajitas property continued to change hands and in 1949 was bought by Rex Ivey, Jr., who hand-dug a well and installed a generator for the area's first electric lights. Due to the closing of the Terlingua quicksilver mines, the number of residents in Lajitas had dwindled to four. In 1977 Ivey sold part of the Lajitas area to Houston entrepreneur Walter M. Mischer, of Mischer Corporation; Mischer had begun development and restoration of the community in 1976...In the mid-1980s Lajitas was a resort town with fifty residents and fifteen businesses. The old church had been restored, and there were three motels, a hotel, a restaurant, a golf course, a swimming pool, an RV park, and an airstrip...The old trading post remained open. In 1990 the population was still reported as fifty. In 1995 the Big Bend area was becoming increasingly popular as a site for movie making. Lajitas, according to one producer, was just about the only place where 'you can shoot 360 degrees'... At that time a TV miniseries, Streets of Laredo, starring James Garner, was being filmed in Lajitas. In 2000 the population was seventy-five."

Today the farseeing Mischer's and Ivey's have been replaced by another caring and creative owner, Kelcy Warren. After a disastrous 100-year flood of the Rio Grande in 2008, Mr. Warren committed himself to restoring and updating the property. Today, Lajitas ranks high with the finest of resorts and has Texas' number one rated golf course, the Lanny Wadkins' designed Black Jack's Crossing. There are few locations where you can shoot the "vast and primitive" desert during the day and bask in the lap of luxury at night – enough very nice rooms and houses for the largest shoot. GOLF COURSE

"Black Jack's Crossing is the centerpiece of Lajitas Golf Resort...Black Jack's Crossing was designed by golf superstar Lanny Wadkins, winner of the 1977 PGA Championship...Named after U.S. Army General, "Black Jack" Pershing who pursued Pancho Villa across the Rio Grande, the golf course combines the historical features of the land with stunning setting...Several breathtaking mountain holes set against spectacular mountain vistas make this course a true work of art."



The Director of Golf is the very affable PGA Pro Greg Smith. Black Jack's Crossing Pro shop is located in the historic Lajitas Trading Post, which was built in 1899. It also houses the Fayette Yates Texas Longhorn collection that fills five rooms with over 1,000 Texas longhorn cattle mounts. The course is a par 72 with five sets of tees that range from the Black tees of 7413 yards, the Maroon tees of 6858 yards, the Gold tees of 6111 yards and the Rose tees of 5442 yards. The course is a dramatic ocean of green in the midst of the Chihuahuan Desert Mountains on the edge of the Rio Grande. It is rated the number one course in Texas by the Dallas Morning News.

LAJITAS INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

The [airport](#) was recently renovated and updated in 2014. "Lajitas Airport is a privately owned airport for the use of the resort's guests and property owners. The runway has full 100LL and Jet A fuel, complimentary tie down services and offers transportation to the resort. The 7500' Lajitas Airport runway and airport complex is designed to accommodate a wide range of aircraft, giving guests the flexibility to fly in on virtually any sized aircraft.



Landing reservations for Lajitas Airport must be made at least 72 hours in advance of your arrival. Please call the Lajitas hotel front desk at (432) 424-5000 to arrange your arrival and ground transportation. The Brewster County Sheriff barracks is located on the Lajitas Airport property, so your aircraft is safe and tucked away while you enjoy your vacation at our golf resort.
